#### From the Pastor's Desk



Today, sharp differences of opinion on many issues have surfaced with increasing frequency and intensity—both in our nation and church.

Most recently the issue of immigration has boiled to the surface. Passions run high on both sides of the aisle, as thousands, perhaps millions, stand under threat of deportation. The past week we have discussed at staff meetings and session that it is possible we have persons connected to our church who may be deported. We are debating what to do if ICE comes to the church or intrudes at worship. But let me put aside the political debate for now and ask, what does the Bible say about migrants or aliens?

In Genesis 23:4 Abraham begged the Hittites for a place to bury Sarah, saying, "I am an alien and a stranger among you. Sell me some property for a burial site so

that I can bury my dead." The Hittites kindly complied.

Both in Deuteronomy and Leviticus, the Lord admonishes his people to be kind to the "alien" among them "for you were aliens in the land of Egypt" (Dt.10:19; 27:19; Lev. 19:34).

There are many other such verses on extending kindness to "aliens," but most poignant is Matthew 25:31-46. In this passage, kindness rendered to the hungry, thirsty and "stranger" is considered to be kindness to Christ himself. Sheep show compassion to the "least of these," and goats not. In the final judgment where God separates the sheep from the goats, Matthew is clearly urging us to act compassionately—lest we end up with the goats.
