CHILDREN'S MINISTRY - Darcy Fluitt

Sunday mornings are always the centerpiece of Children's Ministries. Children gather to hear a Bible story and engage in concrete activities that provide the framework for conversations about faith. A welcome addition to Kids' Church this past year was worship led by Doug Wiggers.

In 2024, events that happen on Friday evenings emerged as a growing part of the ministry to children and their families. The Friday Night Supper Club, initiated in the fall of 2023, gained



momentum in 2024. This is a casual opportunity for the entire family to gather for a meal in someone's home on the first Friday of every month. EPIC, the preteen youth group, meets on the third Friday of every month. Known for crazy games, generous slices of Little Caesar's Pizza, and a safe place to ask questions about their faith, an average of fifteen 4th-6th graders look forward to this monthly event. The Friday Night Experience has become an anticipated quarterly

event in the life of the church. Marked by a different theme at each gathering, those in attendance can always expect lively worship, a Bible story, a shared meal, and a chance to play and connect with one another. Darcy Fluitt and Soo Tee Lim are grateful for another year of being part of the lives of our children and their families at FPC.

YOUTH MINISTRY - Cory Myers

Youth Ministries has been busy creating opportunities for students to experience Christ's redeeming love and convey that directly with their lives to the world they live in. This last year's highlights have been our students' engagement in international missions through our Spring Break Mexico trip as well as locally connecting through service to our local community with our Monthly Sunday Service day. We have worked hard to change from an event mentality to an ongoing living faith reality. God has been hard at work in the hearts and lives of our high school and middle school students.

The Youth have been involved in Bible study, regular fellowship evenings, special trips, service opportunities, and summer camp, to name just a few. Highlights from youth events in 2024 include:

A salient highlight in March was the Mark Labberton weekend in cooperation with our daughter church, the Cove. Mark's messages encouraged us to avoid small-minded bickering and grow into the vast truth of the Gospel. His goal was to encourage and strengthen faith in uncertain times, and that he did. Equally important, the fellowship between our two congregations was deepened and broadened.

One of the great strengths of this congregation is deep love for one another. The compassion of Colleen and Deacons (and many others) provides quiet consolation to many in time of need. Another of the great strengths of this congregation is intentional discipleship. The Enlighten-Up series proved that Presbyterians can return on Sunday nights to discuss an interesting topic. Cory and Darcy used their creative skills to rebuild children and youth programs pinned to the mat during COVID-19. Several classes that foster growth were well-attended, including Kent's, Allie's, and a course on the Enneagram. We heard sermons on grace in late summer and fall, and Advent was beautiful--for many, reaching a crescendo in the Christmas concert. The committed staff of FPCSR worked hard to cut expenses and persevered through all the changes. We were all delighted to end the year with the budget deficit erased!



ADULT DISCIPLESHIP -Allie Shoulders

Christian discipleship is the process of orienting the whole self around the person of Jesus, his life and actions, as well as his teaching. Adult Discipleship endeavors to offer solid Biblical teaching (Sunday classes and lectures) as well as opportunities to consider how we can live out our faith everyday (Soul Training Workshops, small groups, EnlightenUp, movie nights, Connecting Through Nature events, Dinners for 7 or 8.).

- Two Churches One Heart We experienced the joy of partnering with The Cove to host a special weekend of learning and joint worship with Dr. Mark Labberton in March. It is hoped weekends like this will become an annual event.
- Presbyterian Women has been blessed with an enthusiastic and thoughtful leadership team, strong studies that have encouraged spiritual growth and in creative service earning donations for handmade items that benefit Redwood Gospel Missions women's ministries.
- Excellent classes that challenge assumptions and increase our love for God. Several examples are: Our Hope in Christ of Resurrection with Rev. Kent Webber, Science Declares the Glory of God with Bob Gardner, Bob Shoulders and Jack Swearengen, Missiology in the 21st Century hosted by Bev Swift, and Enneagram classes taught by Laurel Quast and Carlyn Knight.

MISSIONS & COMMUNITY SERVICE

FPC continued to contribute 11% of donations to global and local missions. We support seven mission partners and associates around the world, and several mission partners in Sonoma County, including the Redwood Gospel Mission and Catholic Charities. In addition, our Oleari scholarship fund is helping five individuals get further training in ministry in Africa, South America and the Middle East. Our mission committee will lead a "mission Sunday" on March 30 to celebrate our call to God's mission.



BUILDING & GROUNDS

Our beloved building that is home to First Presbyterian Santa Rosa continues to receive improvements at a steady pace. The largest project in 2024 was the patio roof replacement outside of Ingram Hall. The deteriorated flat roof was replaced with new, and the rain gutters were relocated to drain water away from the building.
